New London Branch AAUW Meeting Minutes September 13, 2012

President Kerry O'Keefe called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm at the Waterford Library. Following her reading of our Mission Statement Kerry requested acceptance of the minutes as printed in our newsletter. No corrections were required. Kerry then thanked the Board for providing refreshments and welcomed a visitor—Barbie Quartella.

Finance Chair Claudia Laxar reported the following: Checking Account \$4,198.15, Savings Account \$300.20, Permanent Fund CD \$1,707.43 and Ellen Baird CD \$1,138.48. Our grand total assets are \$7,344.20. Claudia also announced that our account is protected from checks bouncing due to a new program as a business customer at Citizen's Bank.

Newsletter Editor Gale Bradbury announced September 20th as the deadline for information for the October/November News and Views.

Elizabeth Hume reported on Hospitality and Book Group. A sign-up sheet was passed around for refreshments for the year. The book group meets on September 26th.

Under Scholarship the Board has agreed to give Corrine Eichelberg \$1000(our return-to- college Scholar) with other recipients being chosen in the spring. Some funding was also given to Mitchell College for a national workshop.

Under cultural interests Kerry presented information regarding performances at the Spirit of Broadway. Kristen Geshel wanted members to know about Cherish the Ladies on October 6^{th} at Connecticut College. On October 3^{rd} the ACLU will present a panel discussion on Free Speech.

Under new business Kerry announced that she is looking for a volunteer to run the Annual Dog Watch Fundraiser. She is also looking for a microphone for our October author event to avoid a charge from the Norwich Inn. A menu for our Holiday event was selected. Grilled chicken or Salmon on salad greens was preferred.

For the Book Author Luncheon a sign-up list for volunteers was passed around. Kerry also mentioned the following raffle donations thus far: two tickets to the Spirit of Broadway, a boutique basket from the Norwich Inn and Spa, two family memberships from the Slater Museum and four adult tickets to the Pequot Museum.
