Dr. Lindsey B. Harlan, Professor of Religious Studies at Connecticut College will speak about heroes and hero worship at our September meeting. She will begin with martial heroism including hero worship in



India and moving on to the United States will focus on Arlington National Cemetery and related civil war battles for Corinth Mississippi. She will also touch on lesser known places such as the Game Fishing Hall of Fame, Swimming Hall of Fame, Jimi Hendrix's gravesite and Kurt Cobain's memorial bench.

With support from a National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship, Dr. Harlan is currently writing a book, tentatively titled *Lasting Impressions*, which analyzes Indian hero cults in Rajasthan, a state in western India. She has also authored *The Goddesses' Henchmen: Reflections on Gender in Indian Hero Worship*, and *Religion and Rajput Women*.

The new rules require new health insurance plans to cover women's preventive services such as well-woman visits, breastfeeding support, domestic violence screening, and contraception without charging a co-payment, co-




