We begin another year of AAUW with Dorothy James speaking about the recent changes in voting patterns. A former Provost and Dean of the Faculty at Connecticut College, Professor James is one of the country's most highly regarded political scientists on the Presidency and on policy studies. She has published extensively on American politics and policy analysis, including her books: *The Contemporary Presidency*; *Poverty, Politics and Change*; *Outside, Looking in: Critiques of American Policies and Institutions, Left and Right*; and *Analyzing Poverty Policy*. She has also published numerous articles in scholarly journals and chapters in books.

Professor James received a grant for a Pearl River Delta Faculty Development Seminar funded by the Fulbright-Hays Group Projects Abroad Program, organized by the ASIA Network and Hong-Kong Center. She spent four weeks studying the impact of recent major economic growth in the Pearl River Delta, China, in summer 2005.



Convention. Lin Rising, our State College/University Liaison, was honored by National AAUW for having the highest percentage of participation in the college university programs in the NATION!!!!! Carol Virostek was also recognized by the state AAUW for her continued dedication to equity and education for women. An annual NCCWSL scholarship has been established which will be named in her honor.

Peggy Williams, a National AAUW Board member from Vermont, shared pertinent facts about our national organization. AAUW has attained excellence in fiscal responsibility for non-profits. Membership, for the second year in a row, has increased by 100,000, mainly student affiliates. Four million dollars in fellowships and grants is awarded yearly. LAF is funding 8 major sex/gender discrimination cases, as well as funding 8 campus outreach programs which are focused on sex/gender discrimination. AAUW is also creating 2 national programs, Tech Trek and Tech Savvy, which are day /week long STEM camps for girls. Applications should be available at aauw.org/STEM. The 2013 National Convention will be held in New Orleans on June 9 - 12.

A table talk luncheon was then held which provided an opportunity to meet other members to exchange ideas that would enhance local branch activities. Jennifer Smith Turner, CEO of Girl Scouts of America, completed our day by speaking about girls, women, and the future!

Barbara Guerra and Linda Shailor are the discussion leaders. We are reading this year's One/Book/One Region



Professor James received the Policy Studies Organization 1998 award as the "Outstanding Woman in the Field of Policy Studies," and that organization's 1997 award for "One of the Best Policy Studies Books Published Since 1975." In 2001 James received the Student Government Association (SGA) Award for Teaching Excellence.

James began teaching at Hunter College, CUNY, served as chair of the political science department at Virginia Tech, then served as Dean of the School of Government and Public Administration at The American University in Washington, D.C., before coming to Connecticut College as Provost and Dean of the Faculty in 1989.

She is past president of the Policy Studies Organization and has served on numerous governing boards of professional associations and journals, including The American Political Science Association, The American Society for Public Administration, the Puerto Rican Legal and Education Defense Fund, and the Everett Dirksen-Adlai Stevenson Institute of International Policy Studies at the University of Illinois.
