Mathew M. Duman will highlight a selection of gargoyles & grotesques found on the buildings of Yale University's campus in New Haven, Ct. Using photographs from his *book An Education in the Grotesque: The Gargoyles of Yale University, Mathew* explores the artistic, historic, architectural & even humorous significance of these decorative sculptures & their role in communicating the identity of Yale University as a place of learning & enlightenment.
