Wallace Salisbury, a native of Connecticut, was a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation for over 25 years, serving in Knoxville, Tennessee, Monterey, California, New York City, New York, Washington, D.C., Providence, Rhode Island, Boston, Massachusetts, and New Haven and New London, Connecticut. In addition, he had temporary duty assignments in Paris, France, San Juan, Puerto, and Moscow, Russia.

After retiring from the FBI in 2009, Mr. Salisbury served an additional 2 years with the bureau as a consultant on National Security matters.

He holds a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's Degree from the University of Connecticut, and is currently writing a novel.


