Their mission is to provide services which strengthen families, promote health, and prevent child abuse and neglect. Madonna Place is a family support agency serving all of New London County and beyond and a leader in the field of parent education, home visiting, child abuse prevention services and service to fathers.

Dear Ladies,

Happy February!!! I was totally taken with our last presenter Dr. Jessica Sommar, Director of Spiritual Care at Yale-New Haven Hospital Group.

Jessica's slides of China inspired me to take a trip to China in the near future. Since last February, I have been volunteering as a Chaplain's Assistant, and I have been taking direction from Jessica.

When I attended the AAUW CT conference last spring, the keynote speaker was Kate Farrar, a very energetic young lady and Executive Director of CWEALF, Connecticut Women's Education Legal Fund. Upon my return from the conference, I have received several mailings from Kate. Every year, CWEALF honors women who contribute to the advancement of women, girls and families in Connecticut. CWEALF's Maria Miller Stewart Awardees and Champions of Change inspire others through their resilience, hope, innovation, and passion to chart the way forward for gender equality. Since I was curious and did not know who Maria Miller Stewart was, I discovered she was a free Black woman in Hartford in 1803 who became the first American-born woman to speak in public at an organized lecture. Stewart spoke out with force on the rights of women. 2019 Maria Miller Stewart Awardees are an extremely gifted group of ladies. They include

- Ella Briggs, 2019 Connecticut's Kid Governor for her efforts to elevate LGBTOIA youth issues.
- Glynda Carr, Co-Founder, Higher Heights for America-for her founding of the only organization in the country to build the political power of Black women.
- Michelle Duprey, Director, Department of Services for Persons with Disabilities, City of New Haven-for her leadership and advocacy for women with disabilities, and
- Dantaya Williams, VP Human Resources, Commercial Engines-Pratt & Whitney for her efforts to advance women's leadership in the workplace.

I applaud each of them. It would be exciting to have one of these talented ladies lecture at one of our monthly meetings.

I was also taken with an article I received about Attorney Shanique Fenlator; Attorney Fenlator is a member of C.A.N. Cooperating Attorney Network. She is driven by her personal litigation to be a civil servant. She writes: "I am an immigrant and a woman; when a client looks at me, I know that they can see themselves. That relatability and the confidence that is created by it is not something that I take for granted." My conclusion after reading some of these articles is what a fabulous group of young women are affiliated with CWEALF.

I look forward to seeing all of you at our February meeting when Ann Pamela Cunningham will visit. She can't wait to tell you how she and some of her fellow regents from the Mount Vernon Ladies Association of the Union saved Mount Vernon. Stay warm and happy sledding, Gay


