In February, Elizabeth Wood, Director of the Stonington Historical Society spoke about new research into the life of Venture Smith, an enslaved person who was able to buy his freedom and the freedom of his wife and children. In March we were treated to a portrayal of Eleanor Roosevelt with author and historian Carol Cohen. During the first half of the program Ms Cohen as Eleanor walked us through her invitation to participate as a delegate to a newly formed human rights committee. The second half of her presentation featured life lessons and quotes of Eleanor learned during her life.
